

Understanding the graphs and expected levels of achievement

This interim report gives information about your child's achievement at this time of the year.

Note: The expectations shown on this sample graph are for the **end of the year** or for the **time at school**. Because of this, your child may have not yet reached the expected level but indeed be working towards it (ie the green boxes), and reach it by the end of the year.

The expected level/National Standard are a mark in the sand but as educators we are most interested in our children making progress. Achievement needs to be owned by the child, whānau and school. Children need to know where they're at, what they need to do to progress, and understand how they're going to get there.

Shift in achievement is commendable and desirable so movement from **below** to **close to** the standard demonstrates clearly that a child is progressing.

We look forward to meeting together in week three of next term to talk in depth about, and celebrate together our learning.
