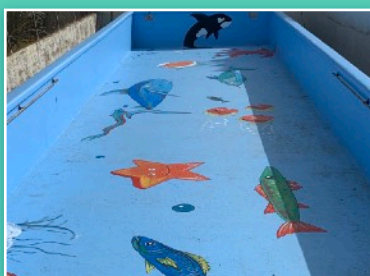
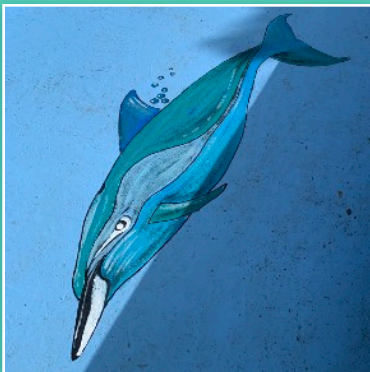

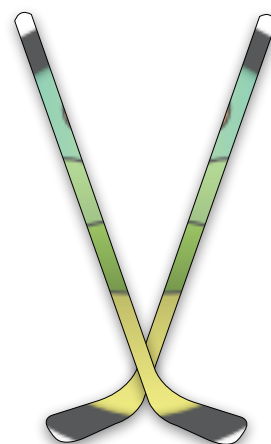

The report will contain samples of student's learning as well as comments from your child's teacher.

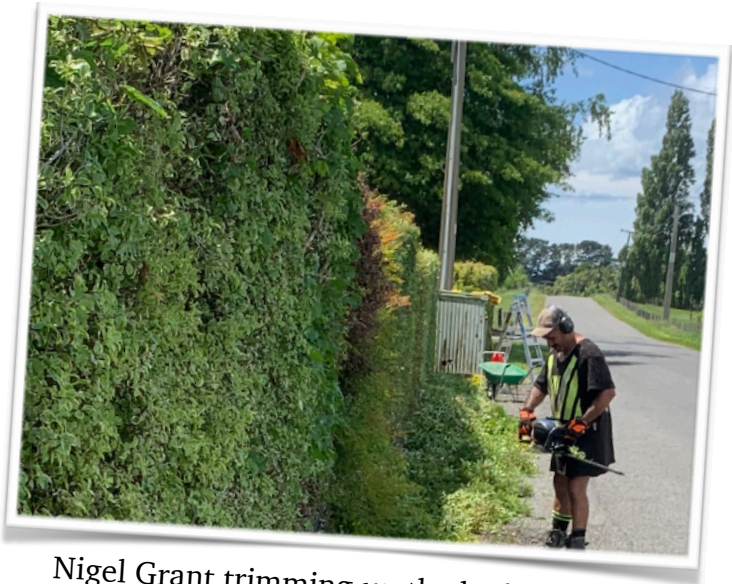
